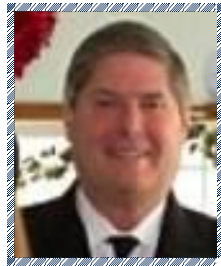


## From the Commodore's Bridge

## Around the Grounds



The Water Pump experienced another problem, the air hose needed repair. A big Thanks to Phil Deming, who helped Martin troubleshoot the problem. Phil wrapped the hose with tape, which is a very temporary fix, but proves it's the problem. Martin will call Johnson Well Service to complete a more permanent repair.

Sat., July 9<sup>th</sup>, the Men's and Ladie's bathroom had a clog and the system backed up into the bathrooms. Martin had to run a plumbing snake to clear the problem, followed by a cleaning. Phil Deming once again, was there to help Martin. Martin had to remove the lock from the men's room door, the lock broke, he hopes to repair it.

In relation to this problem, we had indicator lights on our septic system that the system was near capacity, so we also had a pump-out. Given the frequent rains we've been getting and the upcoming large event in July, we felt this was a good preventive measure.

Last week Geoff Bauman trimmed the Maple trees and other trees, and Chuck O'Brien helped haul the brush when he was in the area.

Craig Hajos, spent half a day removing the unwanted weeds in front of the club house. Last year, Geoff Baumann had it all cleaned up and I had expected Kevin Keyers to maintain it. Each time I reminded Kevin that it was getting out of hand; he would say he would take care of it Saturday. He has not, so I am looking for a new helper.

Geoff Baumann replaced the screen door on the kitchen/icemaker room entrance. He also installed a new hydraulic closer. The new closer is installed on the lower part of the screen/storm door, and with your foot, you can tap the button to hold the door open (such as when your hands are full). To release the hold, you push the door further open and it releases the hold. Ask for help if you can not release the door.

The sunroom entrance also needs a new screen/storm door, but the siding has to be removed prior to replacing the door, as the whole frame is failing. We have slated this repair for winter, since this is a high traffic area. For the time being, Geoff has installed a new door closer.

The pool chairs were suffering sun damage, and were cracking and breaking—becoming quite dangerous to members using the pool. The chairs and lounges are being replaced, with the help of David Fuchs and proceeds from the Entertainment Fund and the Merchandizing Account.

The men's bathrooms have been gutted and re-wired by a professional electrician, along with some plumbing upgrades. So the ladies' bathroom is still Co-ed until these upgrades are completed.

## CYC Events

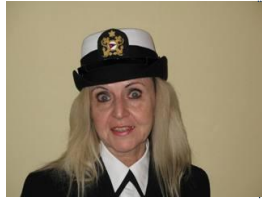

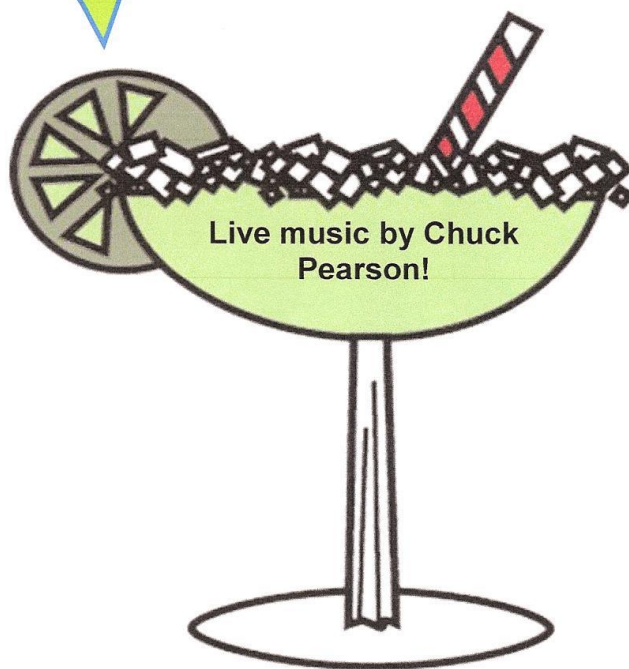
