Corinthians, I am looking forward to serving as your Vice Commodore in this coming year, and I will surely need your help. I plan to continue the practice of keeping the “To Do” list and, with your help, we will “git ‘er done” quoting Larry the Cable Guy.

My first accomplishment: We now have a Reservation Tab in our Corinthian Yacht Club Website. (www.cycchesapeake.com) Click on the Reservation Tab, and there is a calendar which has the various room and cottage reservations. This will help you know what is already booked and show you what is most likely available. The preferred method of making a reservation is by **email**. **Subject Line: Reservations.** List the dates you plan on spending the *night*, which room or cottage, and your name. I will confirm receipt of your email and I will pass the information to the Web Master who will post your reservation on the calendar. After a day or two, you can go the website and verify that your reservation was correctly posted. For the few people who do not use email, please call my home office/Allusions Stained Glass - phone 301 937-4437 and leave a detailed msg. Who, What, Where, and When and Phone number. Your reservation is confirmed when your check is received, otherwise you have a “tentative” reservation.

The current rates are - Cottage 5 – \$65.00 per night – \$400.00 per week +\$10.00 Pet fee per day (one dog only, or one cat) – Check In and Check Out at Noon.

Club House – No Pets
Comm. Room \$55.00 per night - One Queen size bed and One Trundle Bed (two twin beds)

Vice Comm. Room \$50.00 per night – One Queen size bed and One Trundle Bed (two twin beds)

Rear Comm. Room \$40.00 per night – Two Single Beds

You are responsible for cleaning the Cottage or Bedrooms before you leave, and providing linens and towels for the occupants.

If you do not know the Club house door combination, be sure to ask for the information.

Note: If you cook and eat in the Club house, please clean and put away the dishes, clean the stove or grill and sweep the floors.

Reminder - No Glass inside the fenced area of the Swimming Pool – No pets in the Pool Area.

Pets must be on a leash except in designated areas for exercising under supervision.

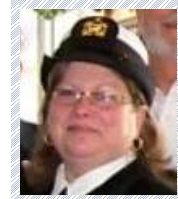
Cruising Schedule
